



# Letters Patent

WHEREAS an application has been filed to incorporate a corporation without share capital under the name

## THE PENINSULA LAKE ASSOCIATION

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Consumer and Commercial Relations is the member of the Executive Council to whom the administration of The Corporations Act is assigned.

THEREFORE I, by virtue of the aforesaid powers vested in me, do by these Letters Patent issue a charter constituting the applicants named in the application which is attached hereto and which forms part of these Letters Patent, and any other persons who become members of the corporation hereby created, a corporation without share capital in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND DECLARED that the Letters Patent shall also contain and be subject to the following terms, conditions and provisions:

- (a) The corporation shall be carried on without the purpose of gain for its members and any profits or other accretions to the corporation shall be used in promoting its objects.

We, the applicants, hereby apply to Your Honour to issue, by letters patent, a charter under The Corporations Act constituting us and any others who become members of the Corporation without share capital thereby created a Corporation without share capital and in support thereof state the following:

1. Each of the applicants is eighteen or more years of age.
2. The name of the Corporation to be incorporated is THE PENINSULA LAKE ASSOCIATION.



3. The objects for which the Corporation is to be incorporated are:

(1) To protect and promote the interests of all owners of property bordering on or adjacent to Peninsula Lake in the District Municipality of Muskoka, Province of Ontario.

(2) To preserve healthful and sanitary conditions on and in the vicinity of Peninsula Lake and to preserve the scenic beauty and peaceful enjoyment of said Lake and the surrounding area.

(3) To represent the interests of all owners of property on or in the vicinity of Peninsula Lake before local, provincial and national authorities and to take whatever action may be deemed fitting and proper and in the common good in connection with such questions and issues as may from time to time arise including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, matters relating to:

- (a) the preservation of the quality of the water;
- (b) water levels;
- (c) health and safety, including matters relating to air and water recreational activities;
- (d) roads and road traffic;
- (e) fire protection;
- (f) maintenance of any public wharfs and docks;
- (g) marking of shoals and other hazards to navigation;
- (h) protection of fish, game, wildlife, flora and trees and the stocking of waters with fish;
- (i) taxes;
- (j) building and zoning restrictions;
- (k) protection of property of members of the Corporation.

4. The head office of the Corporation is to be situated in the City of Toronto, in the Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, in the Province of Ontario.
